What is COVID-19?

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a respiratory illness that affects your lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus and affected individuals can display a range of symptoms from mild to severe illness and death for confirmed cases. Affected people can also be entirely asymptomatic. Transmission is by respiratory droplets and direct contact. This Risk Assessment template must be considered alongside current Government guidance as well as guidance from England Netball. Netball Organisations should also consider their existing Health & Safety documents alongside this and this should be kept under continual review. The COVID-19 Officer for your club, league, county or region will need to ensure that this risk assessment remains up to date and in line with both latest Government guidance as well as England Netball's latest guidance.

Additional page of further club Covid mitigation related to league/competition activity ..BSDNL; Harlow; Herts, friendlies

- LCO to be one of the club contacts for all leagues BSNC participates in. And/or deputy on all club team whatsapps.
- All team personnel ie players and officials (umpires, scorers primary carers coaches) to sign/complete any league forms mandated, with access to relevant league documentation/guidance and all related updates/additional requests arising thereafter.

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- Team Capts briefed as players' point of contact and responsible for communication and team Covid mitigation compliance each fixture, reporting back to club Lead Covid Officer and committee. (Compliance includes: any covid specific health screening on the day; masks where mandatory; sanitising of hands, balls and cleaning of other match equipment at required intervals, an arrangement for bib washing each game; any distancing measures eg entrances & exits, home/away bench areas; whatever is mandated around scoring, primary care.) /LCO/delegated committee members and captains
- **Defined meeting/collection points for any** U18s and clearly communicated to them, their parents/guardians
- · LCO and Team capts
- Club to provide & replenish team kit bags with the necessary **equipment** (multiple sets bibs as needed; balls; stocked first aid kit etc) and appropriate **cleaning materials** for (sprays, wipes, hand sanitiser, waste bags etc). Capts to monitor and advise when stocks are low.

 - League fees and payment of officials expenses will be predominantly by bank transfer and likely collected in instalments to avoid the handling of cash. Where an umpire does requests cash, treasurer will provide in advance to team captain in a named envelope. *Treasurer team capts*.
